What do the colors stand for?



Think about the colors of your Life Saver candy.

The orange and yellow life savers can remind us of the streets of Heaven which are made of pure gold. There can be no sin there, which means Heaven will be a happy place where there is no sickness, no sadness, or death! But sin is also anything that does not please God. When we take something which does not belong to us or tell lies or lose our tempers or disobey, we are sinning. The Bible says that all people have sinned (Romans 3:23), so not everyone will go to Heaven.



The red life saver reminds us that God sent His son, Jesus, to the world to die for you and me (John 3:16). He took the punishment for our sins so that we might be forgiven and be able to live forever in Heaven with God. Jesus Christ died on the cross and was buried. But the good news is He rose again from the dead after 3 days (1 Corinthians 15:3-4).

JESUS WANTS TO BE YOUR LIFE SAVIOR! Remember the five colors of your Life Saver candy. Let your Life Savers remind you that

- Here are some ways to grow:
1. Read and obey the Bible.
 2. Pray (talk) to Jesus everyday.
 3. Make friends with others who love the Lord Jesus in Sunday School, church, school or in the neighborhood.
 4. Tell others about what the Lord Jesus has done for you.

The green life saver reminds us to grow like a new plant in our faith.



The clear life saver reminds us that the moment we believe in the name of Jesus Christ, and ask Him to be our LIFE SAVIOR He will forgive and SAVE us from all of our sins. If you believe that the Lord Jesus died for you, you can choose to receive Him as your Savior. Just admit to the Lord Jesus that you have sinned and need His forgiveness (He will clear your sins away). Trust Him to help you turn away from doing wrong. The Lord Jesus will stay with you forever, for He promised never to leave you. (Hebrews 13:5).

Are you wondering what will happen if you do something wrong? As soon as you know you have sinned, tell the Lord Jesus about it. The Bible calls this confessing, which means "telling on yourself." Ask Jesus for forgiveness.
